

 - Each child got a book from the library which they should read daily, as well as homework readers.
 - They can complete a book review on one of those books or any that they have completed recently. Templates for book reviews can be found on twinkl.

- o Novel: 'Stanley and the Magic Lamp'
 - We have attached a booklet of questions/activities based on the novel as well as the same booklet with the answers.
 - This booklet could be used for oral language discussions/prompts for questions based on the 5 chapters. It could also be used for written work.
 - Discussion on plot, characters, likes, dislikes, sequencing events, discussing likes/dislikes of the setting, drawing conclusions about what has happened in the story.
 - There are elements of the booklet which the children will not be familiar with and may need help. (eg. Hyperbole, similes, etc).
- Just handwriting & English book
 - Practicing cursive writing. A page a day.
- Narrative Writing (preparing to write their own stories)
 - Structure
 - Discussing why a story should have a beginning, middle and ending
 - Adding a beginning, middle and ending to a sample of short stories



- Play a game based on telling a story
- Glancing at pictures and describing the events in each picture what is happening in the beginning, middle and ending

Once the have a clear beginning, middle (problem/main events) and end/solution, characters and appropriate language (how to begin a story, time connectives, adjective use for descriptive writing, etc), they will find it much easier to write a story.

• 4 pages based on meáchan (weight) • 4 pages based on toilleadh (capacity) • These are great strand units in the maths curriculum to incorporate hands on activities to consolidate learning. A nice idea might be to use a weighing scale in your kitchen and your bathroom to weigh different items. Estimate with your child beforehand what appears to be heavier, lighter or the same. After weighing different objects have your child place the items in order from lightest to heaviest. (1kg/½ kg, ¼ kg, 1L, ½ L, ¼ L, 1m, ½ m. ¼ m is on the curriculum for second class).
